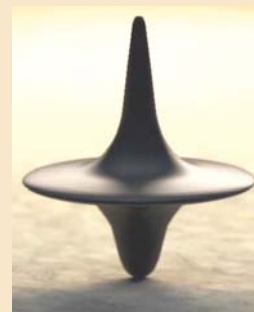

INCEPTION OF CARD

Boudh district is undoubtedly one of the back ward district of Odisha and the people of the district are under below the poverty line. The majority of the population comprising of a large percentage of socially, economically and agriculturally backward people. Efforts are afloat by the Government and other Bodies for the improvement of living condition of the people, but much headway has not been made in that direction. It is therefore, some social worker of Boudh District decided to form an Organisation to create a social awareness in the people and to remove stigma of poverty in them to the extent possible. It is here therefore, that the service of the people with social outlook and great zeal and enthusiasm for social work, one such person of the above description Mr. Dharmu DharPodha, Mundapada, Boudh district, Odisha having academic background in social work and worked for more than five years as a stenographer under Government of India, Ministry of External Affairs.

On 2002 he quite the job and decided to start an Organisation for working on various development activities with special focus on right based issues like welfare of tribal, down trodden destitute and senior citizen people of Boudh district as well as Odisha. March 2006 onwards, the Organisation namely Centre for Agriculture and Rural Development (CARD) started working for the poorest sections of the society mainly backward, schedule tribes families of Mundapada, Brahmanipali, Ambajhari, Baghiapada and Tikarpada Gram Panchayat of Boudh District. On 16th March, 2006 CARD is registered under Societies Registration Act 1860 and started the mission with a specific purpose of promoting programme in the field of Old Age Care, Tribal Development, Agriculture, Health, Education, Environment Protection, Women Empowerment, Disable Rehabilitation, Disaster Relief and Rehabilitation specially poor needy, helpless senior citizen like mentally and physically sick, destitute old and old women, widows of society.

Detail of Activities

Old Age Care

As our esteem voluntary Organisation CARD has been working in the field of social defense a new programme has initiated namely Bridhha Seva Abhiyan which is a integrated programme for older person under CARD Surekhadevee Old Age Home.

Why the Old Age Home name kept Surekhadevee Old Age Home ?

The land where the CARD's Administrative Office and Old Age Home building existed at Kandha Dhurmali the said land is donated by Mrs. Subarna Barik and Ms. Kshirabdhhi Barik who are the daughter of late Surekhadevee of Kandha Dhurmali Village. As, both daughter of late Surekhadevee Mrs. Subarna Barik and Kshirabdhhi Barik have done such a noble deed for the welfare of the society, than in our General Body meeting it has been decided unanimously to keep the Old Age Home name "CARD's Surekhadevee Old Age Home", for the memory of Surekhadevee



Theme of the Programme

There has been a steady rise in the population of older persons increase from 19.8 millions in 1951 to 76 millions in 2001, and 103.8 million in 2011. The projection indicates that the number of 60+ in India will increase to 116.10 millions in 2016, 143.20 millions in 2021 and 173.2 millions in 2026. Continuous increase in life expectancy means that more people are now living longer, but lead a secure, dignified and productive life is a major challenge.

The traditional norms and values of our society laid stress on showing respect and providing care for the aged. However, in recent times, society is witnessing a gradual but definite withering of the joint family system, as a result of which a large number of parents are being neglected by their families exposing to lack of emotional, physical and financial support. These older persons are facing a lot of problems in the absence of adequate social security.

• This clearly reveals that aging has become a major social challenge and there is a need to provide for the economic and health needs of the elderly and to create a social milieu, which is conducive and sensitive to emotional needs of the elderly from the above point of view CARD is currently running one old age home namely Surekhadevee Old Age Home and one Multi Facilities Care Centre for older widows since March 16th 2012. There are 55 helpless mentally and physically sick, destitute old at Our Old Age Home and Multi Facilities Care Centre for Older widows. Most of the inmates are admitted to our old age home by recommendation of different Police Stations, District Administration and Sarpanches and Social Workers.

OUR MISSION

- Maintain and run Old Age Home for welfare of destitute of Old women, widows, old aged mentally and physically challenged people of the society
- To provide free shelter, food, clothes, declines with love and affection to the ailing old.
- Working with the poorest communities including Adivasis, Dalit, Disable people, Senior citizens, and Women headed households to enable them to free themselves from the generational cycle of poverty.

We Believe

We believe that serving the helpless old people is the best way to attain peace and prosperity in life turns out to be a ray of hope these helpless old people suffering from various disease and disorders like Alzheimer, bed ridden and mentally elderly people also have the right to basic age care facilities like health care, social security, safety and security and other basic amenities.

What We Do

CARD's Surekhadevee Old Age Home stepped in to help neglected aged 55 persons under the support of CARD. They were suffering severely from hunger, ill health, left isolated by their kith and kin and communities. After joining in our Old Age Home they are being provided food, clothes, medicine, recreation and accommodation. Now they are free of the feeling of isolation and sharing their thoughts and problems with each other.



Facilities And Service

Free accommodation, food, clothes, medicine and geriatric care being provided to all inmates. Yearly two time heritage tour being organized to visit tourist spot like Puri, Bhubaneswar, Allahabad and other important tourist place of India.



Yoga and Meditation

We have two trained Yoga Teacher who are consistently effort to regain the body intelligence in the inmates to install coordination between body and the mind. Every day one hour Yoga being practices from 8a.m. to 9 a.m. at Yoga mandap .

Nutrition food

Free breakfast, Lunch and dinner is provided to all inmates and a special diet regime needs has been followed when it comes to feeling the inmates, we take care of this fact and put forward the best diet that suits old age. A balanced diet provided in a way that perfectly benefits the inmates, which is rich in calcium, proteins, vitamins and low on fat. Green vegetables and adequate milk is provided too, for a fit and healthy living of our inmates. We understand the significance of hygiene and it reflects in our services.

Medical Care

A team of special, highly qualified doctors visit the Old Age Home for weekly for check up , and blood test are done regularly. This helps them deal the old age disease in a better manner. We also provide physiotherapy tretment which is extremely helpful to the inmates suffering from fracture legs, bone or muscle, paralysis and especially Arthritis. This helps in easing the pain without the harmful side effects of consuming pain killer. As Dr. Manaranjan Mahakud, B.D.S., one of the member of our Governing Body, he visits the old age home weekly for check up. A registration process is carried out for each elderly and their medical history and ailments are recorded along with their basic health check-up like weight, blood pressure. Based on their ailment they are referred to the specialist doctors and free medicines are provided.





Restoration

We have helped more than 500 people find their families and they are presently living with their beloved one.

Admission criteria of inmates

Any person is 60 years and above destitute, helpless, mentally and physically sick can admitted on priority basis

Cremation

When we lose a beloved member of our old age home, we make sure that they are cremated properly and all the rituals are performed according to the deceased religion.

Achievements

After setting up the old age home, we have provided completely free care and shelter services to over 1000 elderly individual.

More than 500 senior citizen have rehabilitated and sent to their own home, which now they are living with their beloved one.

Leisure Activities

We have TV set up in our old age home for the inmates and Bhajan Sandhyas are organized and devotional singers are also invited for short performances with the purpose of bestowing these inmates with some great time. A "Sarva Dharma Prathna Sthal" is a prayer place that is set up inside the old age home where prayer take place.





Kitchen garden

Most of the inmates of the old age home those who are capable to do work they are working in kitchen garden and produce Brinjal, tomato, onion, garlic, potato, green leaf etc. which meet the daily requirement of vegetable of the old age home



Mushroom Cultivation

Some inmates are engaging income generating activities for their pocket money which they are producing mushroom and surplus mushroom are being sale by them in near market.





WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

Due to completion of a project titled “capacitating of women sustainable development” in March 2016, we stopped organizing new self help Groups and scaling up our women empowerment programmers in the new area. However, our field staff members periodically attend self help groups meetings in the target villages and impart refresher training programmes so as to make groups to be independent to their functioning. All the 350 Team Leader received our training support at free of cost and have become independent in their functioning. This resulted in receiving and benefitting our various schemes and services from Government departments, banks, MFIs and other like minded organization.



Detail of the Programme:

Strengthening of Marginalized Families to overcome structural Poverty in Areas with High Rates of Mal-nutrition. (Supported by Action for Women, New Delhi and CARD):

The target group includes 1500 women and their families who live in very different agro-ecological zones like Ambjhari, Tikarpada and Sagada Gram panchayat of Boudh Block of Boudh district. The beneficiaries lived in extreme poverty for the majority of their lives with a nutrition intake of less than 18 K Cal per day. They became chronically malnourished. They are affected by multidimensional causes of poverty: absence of productive assets including land for income generation, social exclusion (on the ground of gender and/ or belonging to certain ethnic group or cast), economic exploitation, no access to jurisdiction, problematic geographical habits (remoteness, weak infrastructure, prone to natural calamities) as well as exclusion from the social safety net. CARD selected 1500 beneficiaries in the framework of previous project.

The programme has been implemented in 28 villages of 3 Gram Panchayats of Boudh Block in Boudh District. The main components are furnished below:-



Objectives:

Women led self-help federations independently support their members in expansion of their income generation activities. The self help organization (Groups of Federation) of the target groups and local partner NGOs have qualified staff and sufficient organizational competencies and capacities to act independently and effectively for the interest of marginalized people.

The self help organizations make civil society's organizations, policy makers and service providers accountable for the needs of marginalized groups.

Anganwadi Training Programme:

We have organized Anganwadi Training to train the trainees i.e. Anganwadii Workers and Helpers with modern and upgraded knowledge of ICDS and to make them enable to translate their knowledge in practical field.

Achievement:

- I. Total 500 and nos. of Anganwadi Workers and Helpers are trained in 10 batches (150 Anganwadi Helpers were trained in 5 no. of batches and 350 no. of Anganwadi Workers (Refreshers) were trained in 10 batches). These trainees were from the district of Boudh.
- ii. The trainees have been trained well up to the mark to excel better in their respective field.



Case Study

Name of the beneficiary : Mrs. Anuri Nayak

Mrs. Anuri Nayak joined in the self help group as a member in 2010. She belonged to a poor tribal family. Both she and her husband were agricultural labourer. As both were agricultural labourer their income was not sufficient to our family, she was forced to borrow the money outside to run her business and many times to meet out the family expenses. Self Help Group is village level women based organization which helps to rural women to attain economic and social empowerment.

Being a regular and disciplined member of the group, she availed loans to the amount of 2,00,000/- during last 5 years for lower rate of interest and hurdles free loan and invested the same in Tailoring and vegetable business. Because of her active involvement in the group and participating in our social and economic empowerment training programmes, she was able to develop the business well. She has been earning an average income of Rs.1,00,000/- month during last 5 years and that facilitated her to spend in meaningful ways as she enjoys equal decision making in her family.

We have given given a loan of Rs.10,000/- under Om leisure foundation, Bhubaneswar, Micro finance programme in september 20016 and Mrs. Anuri Nayak invested the same in her business. Her business is growing thereby family is prosper. She expressed her thanaks to the Self Help Group and CARD for having supported her to come up well in life.

EDUCATION

According to UNESCO , 98% children with special needs globally do not have access to the education they need. In comparison to those of mainstream education, the challenges of the special education sector receive little attention while its students face greater barriers to accessing education

In India, children with disabilities, especially those from low-income background,, do not have access to the education they require. This is due to low societal awareness, social stigma, barriers to identifying children with disabilities, and school systems that are neither sensitized nor equipped to cater to the needs of these children. Though inclusive education is mandated by the Right to Education Act 2009, schools lack the expertise to successfully integrate students in to the mainstream educational environment. These factors make intervention by CARD Government in the sectors of special education and vocational training for youth and children with disability

There has been a sharp divide in the education system that children in rural areas have been no access to quality education and the same is vice versa in Boudh district. To bridge this gap, we have been initiating activities to promote literacy level in the villages by implementing the following activities:

Enabling all the illiterate women in the SHGs to be basic literates i.e. every one must be in a position to put their signature instead of using thumb prints.

- To conduct regular school enrollment campaigns so as to enable and enroll all eligible children to be in schools.
- To provide Educational Scholarship to reduce the drop outs especially among the children in the age group of 6 – 14.
- To provide educational scholarship to the students those who completed HSC successfully with 60% marks and above to study job oriented certificate/diploma courses.
- To motivate girl children education.



Special Tuition classes for Tribal students under the age group of 6 -14 years have been taken up which targeted 100 students who were the slow learners and who could not secure 50% marks were identified through survey and home visits. Under sponsorship Programme amount of 2000/- has been distributed as sponsorship to 34 needy Tribal students. Criteria of selection of students was their economic condition subject to Annual income not more than Rs. 25000/- and land less family, single parent, drug addict parent, long distance from home to school and willingness to acquire better education.



Computer Education

Now a days Computer Education is very common and essential for the common life. It is an integral part of life in every field. Not only for higher education, but in primary school also gone forward and started computer education from primary level. It is not possible for rural based school and the rural student and youth has no scope for avail computer education. Keeping in view Centre for Agriculture and Rural Development (CARD) always giving more stress on Vocational Training for self employment from its very inception. As per the need and demand in our rural area CARD organized various skill development training in its campus where 100 rural students are taking training each year in various courses like Computer Hardware and software. in collaboration with National Institute of System Management, Kolkata sponsored by Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India.





AGRICULTURE

Project Small Farmers – Big Gains:

Agriculture has been the mainstay of many residents in the target communities and with a little help they can dramatically increase their quality of food, income and food security. Activities under this objectives have addressed three key area identified through assessments, improving agricultural practices, improving access to extension and micro-credit services, promoting agriculture allied activities. CARD has promoted interventions with focus on increased crop production and diversification under rain-fed and irrigated systems to improve household food security, nutrition and incomes with reduced risk of climate change, Agro forestry, conservation agriculture and use of organic manures have been integrated with these interventions to ensure sustainability and to enhance profitability by reducing labour and input costs. Improved land and water management practices are being promoted with through farmer's clubs, producer groups, SHGs and other community institutions. Sustainable Agriculture is the key to food security and prosperity of farming communities. It has the potential to address the adverse effects of climate change through appropriate cropping and mitigation mechanisms. There is an urgent need to blend new knowledge and technologies with the time tested productive indigenous practices for boosting farm yield without recourse to perilous methods of green revolution. Intervention for promotion of sustainable agriculture were components of different projects/programmes supported by KrishiVigyan Kendra, Paljhar, Boudh, different agencies/departments such as ICAR,OUAT, Bhubaneswar.





Production and use of Vermi compost

So far total 25 Vermi compost units have been constructed by CARD in four project villages for making compost by using earth worms and a heterogeneous mixture of decomposed vegetables or food waste, farm yard manure and cattle dung. In first cycle of composting an average production of 3.5 quintals is recorded and farmers have started using the compost in their fields too. As advised, so far 21 farmers have constructed sheds over their Vermi compost units.

Total 21 demonstration plots of Rabi Crop are established in 4 villages i.e. 12 in Mundapada and Khuntbandh Gram panchayat and 9 nos in Telibandh Grampanchayat covering 21 acres of land. Out of 21 demo plots 12 plots are Red Gram and 9 plots are Green Gram. After harvesting, yield analysis of 21 demo plots is done and their major findings are as follows:-

- The average production in demo plots of green gram is 8 -10 quintals per acre and average market price is Rs. 6000/- per quintal.
- The average production in Control plots of green gram is 6 – 8 quintals per acre with the average market price of Rs.5,500/- per quintal.
- Total 250 farmers have been trained through training programme on promotion of organic farming, kitchen garden development, exposure visit/Agro-seasonal work shop ,vermi composting, inter -cropping, usage and preparation of the organic manure and bio-fertilizer.





TRIBAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Among Scheduled Tribes, there are certain tribal communities who have declining or stagnant population, low level of literacy, pre-agricultural level of technology and are economically backward. 15 such groups in Odisha have been identified and categorized as Primitive Tribal Groups. Most of these groups are small in number and have not attained any significant level of social and economic progress and generally inhabit remote localities having poor infrastructure and administrative support. Therefore, they become most vulnerable sections among the schedule tribes and priority is required to be accorded for their protection, checking the declining trend of their population and their development. In view of the above CARD has initiated a project namely BANABASI SEVA ABHIYAN in deep forest areas of Boudh district, to enhance their quality of life and socio-economic development.

Objective of the Project:

As Primitive Tribal Groups constitute the most vulnerable section among tribals and inhabit isolated, remote difficult forest areas in small and scattered hamlets/habitats, the BANABASI SEVA ABHIYAN aims to planning their socio-economic development in a holistic manner by adopting habitat development approach and intervening in all spheres of their social and economic life, so that the quality of life of Primitive Tribals Groups is improved and visible impact is made.





Improve Community Infrastructure in Barpadar, Tikarpada G.P.

Barpadar village under Tikarpada Gram Panchayat of Boudh district where all inhabitants are belongs to primitive tribals community. The people of this village are depending on agriculture and collecting various seasonal forest products to sustain their life. Most of the people of this locality believe that Goddess Singhasinee is their saviour and providing protection from different natural calamities, disease and help them to survive in deep forest. Even their cattle, goat, sheep and buffalo are grazing in deep forest without any shepherd, caretaker and return to their respective home at evening due to gracing of Goddess of Singhasinee as per the statement of the priest of Goddess, namely Rabi Dehury. The people of this area i.e. Tikarpada, Bhaghiapada, Brahmanipali Ambhajri, Sagada and adjacent district of Kandhamal have a staunch believe that the Goddess is only savior of them from various problem. As per the statement of the Priest the people of this locality have been worshipping the Goddess before 200 years. In the month of Aswina (October) they observe Maa Singhashnee Puja instead of Durga Puja. About ten thousand devotees are gathering from various Gram Panchayat of Boudh district and adjacent district of Kandhamal, Nayagarh, Sonepur etc. to worship the Goddess. Some senior tribal people of Barpadar village including the Priest brought to our notice that, though lakhs of people have benefitted by the grace of Maa Singhashnee and various political leaders are coming here for worship to fulfill their respective desire, yet nobody has taken any initiative to construct a shelter place i.e. Mandap for Shinghashinee Devi. Every year the villagers of Barpadar have collected Bamboo and straw for reaping the Devi Peetha. As per the request of the local people we have taken an initiative to construct a Temple for Maa Shinghashinee last year near the existing Deva Petha at Barpadar under the project of "BANAVASI SEVA ABHIYAN" and the foundation of the temple has been constructed about 1200 sq.ft. of Area by CARD.





KandhaDhurnal Solar Water Tank Project:

KandhaDhurnal a tribal populated village under Mundapada Gram Panchayat of Boudh District where 90 per cent inhabitants are belongs to primitive tribal People having no drinking water facilities. During our survey, we observed the severe water problem in KandhaDhurnal. The women and children are depending on Kardipali Tank for bathing which is belongs to Bramhanipali Gram Panchayat.

Then we proposed to facilitated drinkingwater system by our Project “BNABASI SEVA ABHIYAN” at KandhaDhurnal village. An overhead Tank having 20 thousand liters capacity water Tank project completed in the month of April 2016 and more than 200 house holds are availing the water facilities from this project.



Activities:

Advocacy on Tribal Issues

- Protection of Constitutional lrights of the tribalsas in the Fifth Schedule of the Indian Constitution.
- Support to Tribal Community for struggles for protetion of their rights against the proposed forest products.
- Facilitating assertion of Forest Rights of tribalsprople and resolution of conflicts vis-à-vis forest policies.
- Monitor public policies relating to tribal people and dialogue with government.
- Advocate for and support sustainable community managed alternative systems of developments.

Strengthening Tribal Self Rule and Decentralized Governance:

- Realization of the goal of Tribal Self Rule through promoting decentralized governance institutions like the Gram Sabha (village council)
- Building capacities of communities to asseret for constitutional and customary rights
- Training Tribal women to take leadership in governance institutions and in community struggle.
- Strengthening collective actions and solidarity among Gram Sabhas to support local camaign.
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- Support to Tribal Community for struggles for protetion of their rights against the proposed forest products.
- Facilitating assertion of Forest Rights of tribalsprople and resolution of conflicts vis-à-vis forest policies.
- Monitor public policies relating to tribal people and dialogue with government.
- Advocate for and support sustainable community managed alternative systems of developments.





Development Support

- Support in setting up primary level community schools and dialogue with government to fulfill its mandate of universal primary education.
- Assist children in enrollment into government residential and primary schools

- Explore resources to support higher education for meritorious tribals students.

Health Training

- Training of Community Health Workers and promotion of traditional health knowledge system.
- Referral Services to district and state public hospitals.
- Coordinate with local health departments and advocacy on tribal health policies.
- Social health counseling for tribal girls.

Alternative Development

- Mobilise resources and technical expertise for providing potable drinking water
- Mobilise resources for providing housing material
- Explore alternatives to energy and irrigation needs like construction of micro-hydro electric projects and check dams with community management
- Lobby with government for implementation of development programmers for infrastructure

Support to Community Based Organisation(CBO's)

- Support local campaigner of CBO's in Tribal populated areas
- Capacity building and training of CBO's for organization management, linkage, resource mobilization, documentation and community mobilization skills.
- Mobilise financial and other resources for the grass roots work of CBO's
- Facilitate linkages with government and other institutions for local issues
- Facilitate legal aid, media advocacy, campaign, documentation, research and development support.





HEALTH

Health is one of the priority areas of our organisation. Though we do not get any special project based funding, we have been getting support from NGO's such as Help Age India, Action for women, New Delhi. As Government hospitals are offering various health care services at the district /Sub-divisional headquarters level. It is important for us to take up services like screening and diagnosing health issues in the villages through conducting health camps at village-level. During the last year, we have taken up the following Health activities with the financial support of Help Age India.

Help Age India Supports for Physiotherapy Centre

With the initiative of Ranjaya Kumar Dash, State Programme Manager, Help Age India, Bhubaneswar, a physiotherapy centre has been established (Donated by Help Age India) and it has been inaugurated by State Head of Help Age India, Odisha, Mrs. Bharati Chakra on November 16th 2016 in the premises of CARD's Surekhadevee Old Age Home which comprising a complete physiotherapy equipments set worth of about Rs.9.50 lakhs. This Physiotherapy Centre which is extremely helpful to the people suffering from fractured legs, bone or muscle break, paralysis and especially arthritis. This also helps in easing the pain without the harmful side effects of consuming pain killer. The physiotherapy services enable the elderly to lead a dignified life where we have provided physiotherapy treatment about more than 1500 elderly patients this year.





Disaster Relief and Rehabilitation Programme

CARD, responds natural calamities like famine, flood, fire etc. When occurred in different parts of the district. A village namely Bandhasahi, under Tikarpada Gram panchayat of Boudh district faced a severe fire disaster in the month of April which led to loss of life, property including all their belongings. Entire houses of the village had ruined by fire. CARD, amongst the first Organisations to intervene and started provide relief with cook food and clothes etc where a relief team comprising 15 volunteers including its Executive Secretary were deployed to look after the relief camp.
